

Chiba Sensei details the history of change **Revamped Musubi heralds** New Order

issolving Birankai Continental Europe was somewhat painful but necessary for us to maintain focus on integrity. It was a question of our ability to self cleanse and to change with minimum sacrifice. Its existence has heavily shadowed the European Union as an ideological model of ten years and has proved to be too ambitious in reality when the individual member countries were still struggling to establish their own footing as national organizations. Having carried out the dissolution does not necessarily mean to deny the idea of creating a big family beyond the national boundaries, but it should be and will be realized of its own accord while the member countries strive hard to establish their own identity as national organizations.

From 4 February 2010, I have had three meetings at Hombu Dojo, Tokyo, Japan, two of which were with Doshu and with Mr Tani, the secretary of the International Department of Hombu Dojo. These meetings have resulted in the formal recognition from Hombu for the following member countries: Birankai Poland, Austria, Switzerland, Greece and Portugal. I decided to withdraw the request for recognition for France and Germany as I see that these two countries are not ready at this stage. My only wish for this event is that this could have been done without traveling to Japan in the middle of winter. (It was the coldest winter in 60 years!)

Along with this major shift of dissolution of Birankai Continental Europe in the summer of 2009, the Shihankai Europe decided to merge Musubi and Shiun into one single publication, Birankai Europe Musubi, in order to encourage the flow of communica-

tion through a unified format. In December 2009 both editors, Dee Chen of London for Musubi and Suzanne Brunner of Lausanne for Shiun met in London for its smooth transition and to exchange plans for the future. I would like to take this opportunity to express my personal thanks to Norberto Chiesa the first editor of Shiun, which was initially published from the town of Lussan, France in 2002, and to Suzanne Brunner as the second editor of Shiun for the past two years. A special thanks to Dee Chen as the editor of Musubi since 1995 and whose work as the General Secretary has been instrumental in the steady growth of British Aikikai and British Birankai, who has furthermore taken the challenge as the editor of the new version of Musubi of Birankai Europe. I would like to ask the Shihankai Europe and the leaders of the national organizations to give their strong support and backup for this new venture to be successful and meaningful to us all.

and with the developing autonomies within our respective countries, I think it appropriate to talk about musubi.

What is musubi? A translation of musubi is connection. unification. blending, harmonious interaction.

As most of you will be aware, I have been travelling throughout Europe since the early 1980s, when I gained my first insight into teaching Aikido in another culture, in Athens, Greece. Armed with limited knowledge and experience, but an enthusiastic spirit. and with a touch of idealism (a chasm I continually fell into) I taught what I knew. Subsequently, I found myself in Bern, Switzerland, whose culture would appear to be diametrically opposed to that of Greece. In both these cases and in the many other cases to follow, I understood that I was in the process of a student, developing an awareness which I would build on in teaching within other cultures.

As a teacher you acquire sensitivity to factors which can impact on Aikido training in each country, such as

culture, economic situation, political instability, a country that is at peace, a country that is at war, the weather, language, etc. This requires actively acquiring intelligence coupled with a martial awareness. This I would consider is one form of musubi.

On my travels, one of the key questions which was often asked of me is "what is the teacher-student relationship?" In my experience, from the earliest days when I entered the Dojo, we were taught a form: to sit in seiza, to bow to the kamiza and then to sav 'onegaeshimasu' and at the end of class 'domo arigato gozaimashita'. This is said by both the teacher and the student, and therein begins one form of musubi. The concept of the teacher and student as being separate and opposite is a product of dualistic thinking. In my view, the essence of the teacher-student relationship is where we experience the benefits of both teacher and student at once.

From my viewpoint, there are three things on which is it important to focus.

• The first thing is our own personal daily practice. A key part to this study is regular practice with our teacher in our Dojo.

• The second thing is a healthy teacher-student relationship, which is an education in the principle of ki-musubi.

• Thirdly, Chiba Sensei has given

us guidelines and the underpinning pillars of centeredness, connectedness, wholeness, liveliness and openness. We should take care to cultivate these forms, as I have observed gaps in knowledge of techniques during examinations and on tatami.

The great strengths we have within Europe are the diversity of our cultures and the diversity of students who had entered the school via different organizations, but were all enthused and sincere in wanting to study within the Birankai group. The drive and energy of these people to come together to make something very fresh and new is inspirational. There is no reason why this cannot continue. Indeed, now armed with a little bit more knowledge and experience, my spirit is optimistic. Perhaps I am still in danger of falling into idealism, but practical experiences have given me a better sense of where the edge of the chasm lies.

Finally, I would like to thank the many people who were very supportive during the period of time when I was injured. I would also like to express my gratitude for the experience of learning from you, your Dojo and your culture.

Dissolving Birankai Continental Europe

Shihan Mike Flynn reports on the legal and financial hurdles completed

t certainly has been an eventful year within the European Birankai. As most of you know, a decision was taken in Poland during the 2009

Summer School to dissolve the Birankai Continental Europe (BCE) and focus our energies on the establishment and maintenance of healthy National Organizations. Of course, a decision of this magnitude resulted in a significant amount of work for the officers of the BCE, as there were innumerable administrative and legal issues to resolve before the wishes of the membership could be fulfilled.

As you will recall, upon voting to dissolve the BCE, it was the decision of the voting membership to elect a Liquidator, and a Dissolution Committee to assist and oversee the liquidator in this task. Furthermore, with regard to finances, it was agreed that after all expenses to BCE were realised, the remaining balance of funds would be given to Chiba Sensei in support of his work in Europe.

As you can see below in the sequence of events that have taken place leading up to and following the decision to dissolve the BCE, the officers of the BCE threw themselves into the task with great commitment. What

is depicted below is the complete sequence of key events which in essence concluded in February of this year.

On behalf of the Shihankai, I would like to thank the President of BCE, Joël Bertrand, all officers of the BCE, and the members of the Dissolution Committee, for their work. Their selfless contributions in support of the growth of Birankai over many years can not be understated. Our sincerest gratitude to all of you.

1 General Meeting in Poland on 19 August 2009

At this meeting, the members of BCE had:



 Norberto Chiesa, Daniel Brunner),

 asked the Liquidator to finalize the current affairs (BCE summer camp 2009; financial support to Chiba Sensei's trip in Japan),

 asked the Liquidator to transfer the balance of the bank account of BCE after dissolution to British

2 BCE summer camp 2009 in Poland

The expenses for this camp totalized 17,999.21€.

BCE has covered a loss of 2,409.21€, as follows:

the sum of 1,053.21€ (£957.37)
 has been paid back on 24 September
 2009 by BCE to British Birankai as its
 share to the cost of Chiba Sensei's
 airfare San Diego–London–Wroclaw

© the sum of 1,356€ has been transferred by BCE to Birankai Poland on 24 September 2009.

3 Legal procedure of dissolution of BCE

This has been completed by the liquidator as follows:

♀ on the basis of the minutes of the General Meeting, the Tribunal d'Instance de Strasbourg has registered the dissolution of BCE on 18 February 2010,

 the official publication of the dissolution was done in the newspaper 'L'Ami Hebdo' on 24 February 2010,

• on 24 February 2011, after a legal period of one year following this publication, the Tribunal d'Instance de Strasbourg will finally register the liquidation of BCE.

4 Transfer of the balance after dissolution of BCE to British Birankai

The sum of 6,334€ (£5,534.78) has been transferred by BCE to British Birankai on 23 March 2010 to be used exclusively by Chiba Sensei in support of his work in developing Aikido in Continental Europe.


Part of this sum will cover the share of BCE for the trip of Chiba Sensei to Japan, as voted at the Dissolution General Meeting. •

ur Dojo was founded in 2003 and is located in a beautiful old gym built in 1910, featuring a sprung wooden floor. O-Sensei's path.

In the spirit of our Birankai teachers, Shihan TK Chiba and Shihan Tony Cassells, we strive to keep a friendly relationship in training. This way, trust can be built on the mat, which in turn allows for both an effective and intensive practice on the mat.

We host three seminars a year, Spring Course, Summer Camp and Autumn Course. We have some frequent guests from the neighbouring and overseas countries. These guests return regularly, as they appreciate the high quality of our seminars and also because they feel 'at home' in our Dojo. Our British friends especially, led by Shihan Tony Cassells and Mark Pickering, have made themselves at home over the past eight years.

Dai Jyo Kan, 40 years of Human Adventure. . .

Bagnols sur Cèze, at the crossroad of the Rhodanian Valley and the mountain hills of the Cévennes, owes its prosperity to the creation of the Nuclear Center of Marcoule.

Towards the end of 1969 a dental surgeon, an old student of Master Mochizuki, together with a group of young people created an association dedicated to the practice of Aikido. In January 1970 our first class, a curious mixture of karate and Aikido, marked the birth of our Adventure.

From then on and until 1975, other teachers brought to us a kind of practice much closer to what we know today. They were followers of the teachings of Tamura Sensei, including our dear friend Roberto Arnulfo.

In 1975 a young Argentinean, student of TK Chiba Sensei, took residence in our region and agreed to take

on the technical direction of the Dojo. In 1978, Norberto Chiesa, expert in tango and Latin dances, joined forces with one of the original-founding members of the 1969 Association, thus generating an enduring complicity between Argentinean tango and the mountains of the Ardeche. From then on, Patrick Barthélémy and Norberto Chiesa have dispensed their teaching at the Dojo.

Another youngster, Thierry Moulinet, took charge of the children courses in 1986 (and still does to this day. . .), courses that were created three years before by Patrick Barthélémy.

Two mayor events took place in that year that were capital to our practice. We gained independence from municipal structures by renting our own premises, and at the outcome of a wonderful ceremony the Dojo received from TK Chiba Sensei its name: DAI JYO KAN*.

In the year 2000 we lived through the last major event of our Adventure: we bought our own Dojo. A considerable investment from all the members and an unfailing solidarity have resulted in the home we now have.

All of you, Birankai friends that may be passing nearby, come share our practice and enjoy our hospitality**.

Ann Jyou Kan, a Birankai Dojo in Paris

The Ann Jyou Kan Dojo opened its doors in April 2006 in the 20th ward of Paris. Many events have marked its development.

In 1986 the original group started in the 5th ward, 1998 not only brings a move to the district of the 'high 20th ward' but we also came under the influence of Chiba Sensei school. This 'Birankai' connection is decisive because it allows us to restart as a group. We then moved to 93 Pelleport Street. Two years later the manager was asked to leave, so were we!!! After a year of hard times we moved back to the place and transformed it into a 'Dojo-School of the Parisian East'. Our initial project is announced in the following manner: "The sole purpose of this traditional martial arts school is to benefit the community. The Dojo is the environment for personal development where one studies the Way. Through the martial, energetic and cultural activities, the human being grows steadily and develops harmoniously. The relationship to others and to oneself is enacted under the rules that govern the life in the Dojo and from this sharing emerges a collective project".

The Deputy-Mayor of the 20th ward opens the Dojo at a special ceremony in September 2006. Then TK Chiba Sensei gives it the name of 'Ann Jyou Kan' which translates as 'House of peace and prosperity'. Today we still maintain strong links with Birankai. We have more than twelve hours of Aikido classes in our Dojo with an additional eight classes in another place.

Membership includes 155 members made up of 90 adults and 65 children, with the following officers: Reynald Deroche as President, Thierry Lecomte as Treasurer and Christian Mathieu as General Secretary. The teaching is under the direction of Anne Ducouret 4th Dan, Shidoin assisted by Cyrille Benoot, Jean-Gabriel Massardier, Stüphane Duclot, Jürchme Lebrun and Ivan Peyron. The Dojo welcomes all ages to numerous events.

This year, we had the honour of welcoming the seminar for advanced teachers and students directed by the Birankai Europe Shihankai.

The summer school in Paris in July will be directed by Shihans and Shidoins. $\textcircled{\mbox{\sc only}}$



The Dojo was founded by Sadek Khetab and Paule Helmbacher in 2005 as a Birankai Dojo. It has a membership of 13 adults.

The practice takes place in a public social and cultural centre which also offers judo classes. There is no rent to pay.

The teachers are not paid and the members pay their fees through the social and cultural centre.

The teachers are Sadek Khetab 4th Dan, Shidoin and Paule Helmbacher 3rd Dan, Fukushidoin, and an assistant.

In order to allow this public social and cultural centre to pay the Aikido teachers for their classes, it would require a greater investment by the teachers to get more students and fees, to develop children classes, and also the teachers should be certified by the state. \mathbf{e} 1.

Copy of Uzès has enjoyed a close working relationship with Dai Jyo Kan, the Dojo of Bagnols sur Cèze.

From the beginning, several teachers took the leadership of the group in succession. A time came when the Dojo found itself without a teacher.

It was at our request that Norberto Chiesa Sensei and Patrick Barthélémy Sensei generously accepted to dispense their teachings at our Dojo. Their engagement revitalized our Dojo and gave direction to our practice.

The commitment of the members grew in depth and the instructors advanced in their practice. Today, Michel Neumann and Fabrice Mahieux are holders of Fukushidoin rank and assume the teaching in the Dojo. The membership stands at about 30 members.

In 2009 Chiba Sensei baptized the Dojo with the name 'Gen Rei Kan' and in so doing he affirmed our identity infusing the Dojo with a strong and beautiful energy. It is our responsibility now to persevere in our way through a rigorous and sincere practice.

Several seminars are organized during the year among which is an annual





What is important to us are the holistic values. These require discipline (physically and mentally), accepting each other and, moreover, embarking on a voyage of discovery that never seems to end. When learning Al-KI-DO you deal not only with the opponent but also with your own self.

We are now offering Aikido training to children from the age of eight upwards. Currently, we are involved with exchange training programmes with neighbouring Dojos in Paris, Strasbourg and Colmar. The main issues are the intensive Aikido training of children and adolescents, the exchange of teachers as well as exchanging European cultures with each other.

In Spring and Autumn, we regularly organize Aikido training courses with international Birankai teachers (Shihan and Shidoin) for young people and adults. We also host a social event annually for the Landau Aikido Community.

As part of our publicity campaign, we participated in the 'Day of the child' in Landau and also at the 'Global day of the child'. We take part in anti-violence programmes in schools and are known to organizations in Landau offering holiday schemes.

The Dojo is an aspect of life embracing the confidence, the space and the order that are contained in the spirit of the five pillars: centeredness, connectedness, liveliness, openness and wholeness. This constitutes a real challenge, on and off the tatami.

ounded in 2002 by Hans-Peter Hoepp, University of Muenster Aikido Dojo has ever since been an assembly point for university students and affiliates taking refuge to strict martial practice of body management, composure and courage in an otherwise highly intellectualized and efficiencydirected academic environment. Inevitably, as part of a university sports programme, Birankai Aikido struggled to make its way among the other physical disci-



plines and to successfully compete for practice time and space in the university sports facilities. Not surprisingly, external and internal influences calling into question 'that weird marital art' that seemed to 'accomplish little in a foreseeable time span' were endless over the first years. Growing support came when more and more news spread via the academic grapevine that the university Dojo was truly providing a programme contrasting and complementing academic strains through vigorous martial exercise resulting in composure of body, mind and social interaction. Only with time the very obstacles that the Dojo had met in the beginning turned into its

basic strength: people increasingly came because 'the other kind of sport' now held a special attraction. At present, the number of people 'just having a snoop around' still continues to be large at the beginning of each term whereas the number of those outlasting the initial disillusionment seems minute in comparison. Over the years, however, the slowly growing core of truly committed members became increasingly known for its radiance of physical, mental and social excellence.

The Aikido Dojo at Kolonos has only been open since September 2009. The chief instructor is Matt Teale (4th Dan, Shidoin). He is assisted by Achilleas Label (3rd Dan), Giannis Papagyris (1st Dan), Louis Abeshi (1st Dan), Angeliki Chrisanthakopoulou (1st Dan) and Angelos Tsantilas (1st Dan). Originally we started at Panellinios Sports centre but the decision was taken to open a permanent Aikido Dojo because we had outgrown the limitations of a shared Sports centre.

We currently have 130 square metres mat space in a light, airy space. We are in the process of ordering some more mats. So hopefully soon we'll have 200 sq metres mat space.

Since we are so lucky to have such a large space, we hold seminars here regularly including some of the Hellenic Birankai seminars. In October we had a great seminar with the Hellenic Birankai's technical director Shihan Mike Flynn and Renata Bohdanowicz 3rd Dan, Fukushidoin. In March we were very happy to have a very successful seminar by Shihan Chris Mooney where there was a total of 80 attendees over the course of the weekend. In these busy seminars we can take advantage of a large open roof-top space for split classes with weapons on the roof and body art in the Dojo.

It is very early days for our Dojo but so far we are very happy with how things are progressing. •

Over 100 students practise in three adult groups. The Dojo runs three mornings, and 11 evening classes for adults weekly.

Over 100 children practise in six age groups (up to 6 years, 7-9, 10-12). There are 20 kids classes weekly. In 2006 the idea of founding a Dojo first appeared and after one year of preparation, the first class was taught in Gdansk.



After a few weeks in the country, I attended some Aikido lessons in a general-purpose gym club, taught by a Nidan in his late twenties, but after about six months, fate had it that this teacher vanished with no prior notice, leaving the school with no trainers. After seeing my credentials, the management of the gym gave me that job immediately.

This fortunate event clearly helped us to jumpstart our development in 2001 as the representatives of Birankai in Portugal. After arriving in Portugal, I was struck to see palm, pine and eucalyptus trees growing together. These are my three favourite trees and it is rare to see them together since each requires a different growing climate. At the summer camp in Méjannes, France in 2001, I asked Chiba Sensei what would be a good name for 'school of three trees', and not only did he articulated the Japanese name 'Sanjukan', but on the next day he handed me a beautiful calligraphy with the three characters. How could I have dreamed about a better outcome of what was just a deep intuition?

Nine years later, and with much water under the bridge, we now have an established training place, with 60 mats, in the historical center of Lisbon. We operate a regular schedule of five hours per week, on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Our group is still



small, about fifteen members, which means about six to twelve people on the mat. This Spring of 2010, was good. We have had, within two weeks in April, the occurrence of three gratifying events. Firstly, our two most senior students passed their shodan test, under the guidance of Shihan Mike Flynn. Secondly, we received our official recognition from Hombu, and thirdly, we had our first class with a majority of female practitioners, representing roughly 30%, which is the goal I had in mind. J.

At this point, when I look back, I am quite happy to see a group in constant evolution, with a core of students that are developing well. The mere fact of having some people who continue to come several times a week, despite a busy modern life, is extremely gratifying, and is a strong motivation for me to continue in this direction.

Looking into the future of Sanjukan, our top two priorities are to increase the membership to twenty five members, and to start preparing for the future by training some students to become assistant teachers.

As a conclusion, taking a step back prompts the question: "What does it mean to found and develop a martial art school?"

The first answer is that we have to preserve the link of the chain of Budo transmission. As teachers, we are given the responsibility by both our own teachers and our students. The second answer is that Aikido, as a tool for personal development, is helping practitioners to be better human beings. Thus, as the founder of the school, I feel that I am contributing to this growth and this provides me an answer to this fundamental question: "How am I contributing to make this world a better place?"



On August 7th this year, Chiba Sensei will conduct an opening ceremony of the new Dojo building. 1.

Chris Mooney is also the Chief Instructor of Gen Sen Jyuku (Warwick Aikido), whose name was given by Chiba Sensei. There is a close connection between the two groups of students. ©

hiba Sensei was first sent to Sunderland in North East England by O-Sensei in 1966. He soon relocated to London, establishing his headquarters Dojo, the London Aikikai in 1967. Following his return to Japan in 1976 London Aikikai has remained Chiba Sensei's Dojo in London and in 1985 Shihan Dee Chen and Eric Beake Sensei took responsibility for the Dojo which was named Shinmei-kan - 'House of New Light' by Chiba Sensei. Following several moves we settled in our present location in Maida Vale in 1990. Throughout this period we have maintained the closest of relationship with Chiba Sensei receiving regular visits from him and his many senior instructors from the USA where he relocated to




San Diego in 1981. Davinder Bath Sensei and Eric Beake Sensei are both senior instructors now in charge of running the Dojo.

There are adults classes from Tuesday to Saturday including body arts, weapons, lai Batto-Ho and Zazen. Children classes are on Wednesdays and Saturdays. London Aikikai has a popular and vibrant website at www.londonaikikai.com.

Eric Beake Sensei started Aikido in 1970 with the Tomiki Aikido Group organized by London taxicab drivers and practised with them for 3 years.

He joined the British Aikido Federation after seeing one of Chiba Sensei's class and was graded Shodan by Yamada Sensei in 1978 in Bridgenorth. He was promoted Shidoin in August 1999 and awarded 5th Dan in January 2002.

Davinder Bath Sensei was born in Punjab, India and migrated to the UK at age 13. He started Aikido training aged 18 in August 1982, achieving Shodan rank in April 1985 with the Aikido Fellowship of Great Britain. He gained a Batchelors Degree in Mathematics in 1987. He met Chiba Sensei in 1987 and re-tested successfully for Shodan with him the same year, followed by Nidan in 1988. In 1989, 1990 and 1991 Bath Sensei 'had the privilege and pleasure' of looking after Chiba Sensei during the UKA Summer

Schools. He was ranked Sandan in 1992, Yondan in 1998 and Godan in 2005. He was certified Fukushidoin in 1997 and Shidoin in 2004.

He has followed Chiba Sensei's teachings since meeting him in 1987 and every year since. He travelled to San Diego, USA on two occasions in 1995 and 1996 each time living in Chiba Sensei's Dojo as uchi deshi. From 2003 he 'has had the unique privilege' of accompanying Chiba Sensei on all his European trips to Aikido seminars as well as personal visits, sometimes attending 4 summer schools with him in one year. He has taken ukemi for Chiba Sensei almost every year since 1987. In 2007 Chiba Sensei declared Davinder Bath Sensei as his disciple.

Davinder Bath Sensei joined London Aikikai when he moved to London in September 2002. He has taught Aikido internationally in Poland, Switzerland, Israel, Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, France, Austria and Greece. He was selected to teach at the British Aikido Board (BAB) National Course in 2008. He is a senior instructor and Dojo-cho at London Aikikai. He is the BAB Representative for British Birankai and a member of the British Birankai Teaching Committee.



Without Chiba Sensei's influence, affiliation then turned to Pat Stratford Sensei and, through him, to master Andre Nocquet of France, one of the first European students of O-Sensei. In April 1979 Eddie gained his 1st Dan from Yves Pielot Sensei of Belgium.

In February 1988 Eddie gained 2nd Dan from John Emmerson Sensei and, in July 1990 he gained 3rd Dan from André Beru Sensei (France) at the summer school in Gujan-Mestras, France. In March 1993 Eddie gained his coaching certificate from the British Aikido Board. In July 1993 Eddie gained 4th Dan from Master Nocquet, again at the summer school in Gujan-Mestras.

In 1995 Eddie decided on a committed change of direction and joined the British Birankai (then called the British Aikikai upon its inception). He began working under the direction of Steve Magson Sensei.

Deciding to re-grade with the Aikikai, Eddie was awarded 1st Dan in August 2004 and 2nd Dan in October 2006. He then gained Fukushidoin in July 2007. In April 2008 Eddie was awarded 3rd Dan.

From summer 2004 onwards he began to work very closely with Joe Curran Sensei. Over time Eddie has also been influenced by Arthur Lockyear Sensei, Tony Cassells Sensei, Chris Mooney Sensei, Ian Grubb Sensei and Mike Flynn Sensei.

Eddie continues to be the chief instructor at the Rainbow Aikido Club and trains and teaches regularly at other northeast Aikikai clubs.

Dojo Biography: During 1979 Eddie Hodgson started teaching Aikido at what was then Teesside Polytechnic, which later transferred to Thornaby Pavilion. The club is now known as the Rainbow Aikido Club.
